On behalf of the NCHO Executive Council and Annual Conference Host Committee, we would like to invite you and your team to join us October 18th - 20th at NC State University in Raleigh, NC for our **2023 NCHO Annual Conference**! We're turning 50! This year's conference theme is *Steering Toward A New Future in Housing & Residence Life*.

North Carolina's state capital has a lot to offer NCHO Conference attendees over the course of the three-day conference. Raleigh is the home of the North Carolina State Fair which will be taking place during the conference. NC State is conveniently located 10 minutes from the State Fairgrounds. Downtown Raleigh, conveniently located approximately 5-10 minutes from campus offers conference attendees a variety of activities and cuisines conference attendees can indulge in when not in programming sessions. The Raleigh-Durham area will provide conference attendees with a plethora of opportunities to connect and build their network through fellowship with housing professionals from across the state.

NCHO is very excited to introduce a new pre-conference experience slated to take place on the afternoon of October 18th. This pre-conference experience was designed to provide conference attendees with the opportunity to learn from and network with professionals who have dedicated their careers to engaging and supporting the continued development of housing professionals and students. 

Hi NCHO! My name is Savannah Matherly and I am the Professional Development Chair for NCHO. When I began my role in January of this year, I took the time to connect with folks across our state to see what they needed professionally, how they wanted to be poured into, and what is preventing them from engaging in developmental opportunities. A lot of institutions are understaffed, so most professionals are overseeing multiple roles and may not have the time, or energy, to go to conferences or watch a live webinar. As someone who also has had to support vacancies and is also in school, the last thing I often want to do in my free time is more work or work-related professional development.

From the conversations I had with folks, the idea of creating an **NCHO podcast** formed as a way to provide professionals in our state a more accessible form of professional development. A podcast allows someone to listen to it more easily and multitask, so that free time can be saved.
